

Licence to Operate a boom type Elevating Work Platform (EWP)

(Boom length 11m or more):

What EWP Training Do I Require?

If you are required to operating a boomlift with the capacity to go over 11 metres you are required to do the Workplace Standards Tasmania (WP) high risk licence.

The Course:

Candidates deemed competent will acquire the necessary skills and knowledge to plan, prepare and complete EWP operations safely and efficiently in accordance with the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work. On completion of this course candidates will be able to conduct routine checks, plan work, check controls, operate and shut down elevated work platforms.

Course Content:

The EWP course is mapped to the nationally recognised unit of competency:

- Legislation, Australian Standards, National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work, codes of practice and company EWP procedures.
- Company risk management procedures and EWP risk control.
- Safe Work Method Statement WP.
- EWP types, working envelope, specifications, job requirements, priorities, identifying hazards and hazard control measures relevant to EWP operation, communication and emergency procedures.
- PPE requirements Aware365.
- Pre-start/Pre-operation checks, set-up, outriggers/stabilisers, ground conditions, mobilising, working around structures and other aspects of operation.
- Shut down, stowage, post operational checks. As per manufacturers, specifications and site rules.
- Practical and written assessment.

Pre-requisite:

Licence applicants must be a least 18 years of age and be physically capable of working at height and performing EWP activities. A basic level of English and basic understanding of mathematics is required.

Certification:

Successful candidates will be awarded the Nationally Recognised unit of competency TLILIC2005A *Licence to operate a boom type elevating work platform*, recognised within the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF). A Licence to Perform High Risk Work, class WP will also be issued upon your application to Workplace Standards Tasmania.

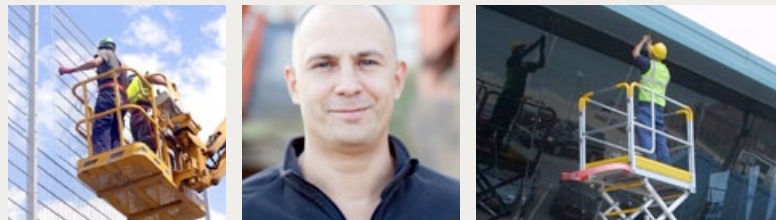

EWPA (Elevating Work Platform Association of Australia Incorporated) Yellow Card

What EWP Training Do I Require?

If you are operating a boom type EWP that has a total reach less than 11 metres you are not required to have a Workplace Standards Tasmania (WP) high risk licence. The training required is the EWPA yellow card.

If you are operating a scissor lift you are not required to have a Workplace Standards Tasmania (WP) high risk licence. The training required is the EWPA yellow card. There are no height restrictions for scissor lift.

The Course:

Candidates deemed competent will acquire the necessary skills and knowledge to plan, prepare and complete EWP operations under 11m for boom type machines and scissor lifts safely and efficiently. On completion of this course candidates will be able to conduct routine checks, plan work, check controls, operate and shut down EWP's.

Course Content:

The EWPA course is mapped to the nationally recognised unit of competency:

- Legislation, Australian Standards, National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work, codes of practice and company EWP procedures.
- Company risk management procedures and EWP risk control.
- Safe Work Method Statement WP.
- EWP types, working envelope, specifications, job requirements, priorities, identifying hazards and hazard control measures relevant to EWP operation, communication and emergency procedures.
- PPE requirements.
- Pre-start/Pre-operation checks, set-up, outriggers/stabilisers, ground conditions, mobilising, working around structures and other aspects of operation.
- Shut down, stowage, post operational checks. As per manufacturers, specifications and site rules.
- Practical and written assessment.

Pre-requisite:

Applicants must be at least 18 years of age and be physically capable of working at height and performing EWP activities. A basic level of English and basic understanding of mathematics is required.

Certification:

Successful candidates will be issued a yellow card and statement of attainment from the EWPA for the Nationally Recognised unit of competency RIIHAN301B – Operate Elevating Work Platform recognised within the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF).

8 hours.
